## Lake Macquarie Wins \$150,000 in 2008 National Thiess Riverprize

A groundbreaking river management project initiated by the Lake Macquarie Project Management Committee has won the prestigious \$150,000 National Thiess River*prize* – the largest award in its field and presented in partnership by International Riverfoundation (IRF) and River*festival*.

Lake Macquarie was announced as the winner at the National Thiess River*prize* Presentation Dinner tonight at the Brisbane Convention and Exhibition Centre during the 11<sup>th</sup> International River*symposium* (1 to 4 September 2008).

River*prize* Judging Panel Chair, Professor Paul Greenfield, said the improvements made to Lake Macquarie's long term sustainability were outstanding and those involved in delivering the project should be very proud of their efforts.

"The Lake Macquarie Project Management Committee has been working towards improving the health and ecological sustainability of Lake Macquarie for a number of years and as a direct result has seen important increases in sea grasses and improved water quality," Professor Greenfield said.

"The project also initiated a dedicated team to implement community education and engagement programs which has developed a permeating culture of green living and positive changes in behaviour throughout the community.

"The inspirational outcomes of this project were made possible through the co-operation of scientists, community groups, industry members and government agencies and exemplify the spirit of the National Thiess River*prize*.

"It's an honor to reward a project that has done such a brilliant job taking river and water issues into its own hands and delivering such exceptional results.

"2008 marks the 10<sup>th</sup> year of the National Thiess River*prize* and it's inspiring to see such dynamic projects improving our waterways' ecological sustainability year in and year out." he said.

Lake Macquarie was chosen over three other outstanding Australian finalists which included the Derwent Estuary in Tasmania, the Tweed River in New South Wales and the Swan Canning River System in Western Australia.

The Thiess River*prize* is a partnership between International Riverfoundation and River*festival* - a dynamic ten day event in celebration of Brisbane's river, people, culture and environment held from 29 August to 7 September 2008.
